Description of the idea/problem/exercise: **Find the missing flower petal!**

The child should find which element is missing from the shape on the right by observing and comparing the two shapes, finding the missing element, and then completing the shape on the right.



- *Why this exercise is good:* It develops observation skills, attention to small details, and memory. In addition, children have fun while playing and learn actively.
- *Has anyone tried this? If yes, when and where?:* No
- *Notes:* After completing the two shapes, they will be similar, matching the base color within a flower. The game can be continued by highlighting another element, now on the left side, and similarly searching for the missing element.
