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Formal and/or non-formal educational setting: **Individual/small group setting**

Most relevant age group: **5-7 years old**

Description of the idea / problem / exercise: **Visual attention, memory**

Place 3 elements of different shapes (triangle, square, circle) into a fabric bag. The player draws any shape from the bag, observes it carefully, and then puts it back into the bag. On a worksheet (which shows all three elements), they select the illustration of the shape they drew and color it in the appropriate color.

Once they have finished coloring, they draw the shape from the bag again (this time identifying it by touch) and check whether they colored the illustration with the correct colors. They should pay attention to the base color as well as the colors of the different sections. This activity can be done with each of the elements.

- *Why this exercise is good:* It develops visual memory, tactile sense, and color and shape constancy. Their graphomotor skills, fine motor movements, and hand–eye coordination improve. They can practice precise coloring and correct pencil grip.
