Description of the idea / problem / exercise: **Find the missing flower petal!**

The child should find which element might be missing in the shape on the right by observing and comparing the two arranged shapes, identify the missing element, and then complete the shape on the right.



- *Why this exercise is good:* It develops observational skills, attention to small details, and memory. In addition, children enjoy themselves during the game and learn actively.
- *Has anyone tried this? If yes, when and where?:*
- *Notes:* After completing the two shapes, they will be similar. Within a flower, the petals opposite each other have the same base color. The game can continue by highlighting a different element, now perhaps on the left side, and in the same way, finding the missing element.
